Professor Ross Deuchar will discuss young people's attitudes towards police legitimacy and their experience of procedural justice in the Scottish context. He will discuss the way in which the rhetoric of procedural justice became firmly embedded within the core values of Scotland's national force but will also document the subsequent crisis experienced by Police Scotland within the context of the use of stop and search. He will also share insights from his recent ethnographic research, funded by the British Academy, which explores the nature and impact of police stop and search procedures in Scotland against the backdrop of unprecedented change.
